Can you share your experiences of accessing speech pathology services? Are you able to access the technology you need ? A study from Griffith University being carried out by a speech pathologist in NSW is trying to find out more about parents' and carers' experience of accessing services like speech pathology and their opinions about different types of services that are offered. The questionnaire takes about 15 minutes to complete and is completely anonymous. The aim of the study is to provide a picture of the availability of services for families in rural and regional areas as well as your preferences for how these services are delivered (e.g. Have you been able to see a speech pathologist if you needed one? How do families feel about telehealth services? What types of services do you think would work best for your child?). We hope that the information provided by families will help inform decisions about services in the future. Athletics - We had seven students go to Dubbo, to compete at the Western School Sports Association (WSSA) Athletics Trials. All seven of our students were successful and then invited to join the WSSA rep team, at the State Combined

High School Championships, at Homebush. Over three days everyone achieved personal bests in all the three track and four field events. Four of the Carenne students are now invited to the All Schools State Championships—for possible selection into the NSW State team to participate at the Nationals at Cairns



Qld, later in Term 4. Benson also went to the PSSA (Primary aged) Athletics Trials at Dubbo and has now been invited to join the Western Region Rep team for his State Championships in Term 4!!

Multi Sports Day - Our school hosted the annual Multi Sports Day at Bathurst Indoor Sports Stadium. Two of our primary aged classes went, and experienced a short introduction to the skills for ten different sports during the day. The different sport's instructors showed our students some of their

sport specific skills. It was well attended with over 140 students from ten local schools and everyone had a great time and lots of fun. Our staff were a bit exhausted by the end of the day, however enjoyed themselves immensely.
