On the last 2 days of Term 3, the Work Experience Canteen Crew were fortunate enough to go on an excursion to the Sydney Fruit Markets, at Homebush.

On our travels we had morning tea in the park at the Three Sisters in Katoomba then headed to our accommodation at Parramatta.

On Friday we got up at 4:30am to head to the Sydney Markets, and were shown around by Shirlene from the Markets Authority.

Shirlene took us to the huge wholesale fruit and vegetable shed where they were selling a vast array of different fruit and vegetables that had only just come to the markets that morning, from the growers all over the Eastern Seaboard.

We saw many forklifts, trollies, burrows and bikes all carrying fruit and vegetables to the near- by trucks bound for the shops and even to Bathurst!

Next stop was a banana wholesaler shed and they explained to us all about bananas and how they get sold onto shops and people.

We had morning tea at their local food restaurant and then had an informative talk to the Food Bank Organisation staff about recycling unwanted or unsold fruit and vegetable to charities.

After thanking the Sydney Markets Authority we visited the Fire Museum at Penrith to have a look at all the fire trucks and equipment that has been used in NSW over the past 100 Years. Upon arrival back home to Bathurst the students gave their parents some fruit and vegetables that the wholesalers had given to us.
