Presentation Days

We are looking forward to our Presentation celebrations this week. While we want everyone to enjoy the celebration, we are required to advise you of some of the details of our COVID Safety Plan for the day. If you could follow the following guidelines, we will be able to ensure the safest experience for all involved.

COVID safe points for parents:

- Please do not attend the celebration if you are unwell with COVID symptoms, unless you have been tested since the onset of symptoms and you have returned a negative result. Similarly, please keep any students away if they are unwell.
