Mel Betland will be working Monday to Thursday, Wendy Lynch and Sam Schofield working as a paraprofessional Monday to Wednesday.




2021 Premiers Reading Challenge


Macquarie Tutorial Centre Katie Moss (Teacher) Julie Buining (SLSO)

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Art News

In recent weeks, our Art Program has focussed on Wiradjuri Wildlife. We have looked at a range of animals and talked about the Wiradjuri names for echidna, kangaroo, owl, snake and turtle amongst others. We've explored a variety of printing methods and combined these with collage and painting. Our junior students had fun using bubble wrap to create snake skins and wattle. They also made starry backgrounds for sponge printed owls, by spattering paint using chicken wire. Senior students have used foam sheets to make multiple black and white turtle prints which were then pasted on to an ocean background made from torn paper. The senior students have also created colourful artworks of cockatoos in the outback and eye-catching kangaroos at sundown. More wonderful work in the art room!
