Teaching and Learning


It has been a very busy and productive term for all students and staff. Students and our paraprofessionals have been working hard and enjoying the activities and programs that are running throughout the school.



The students have been working hard on many new skills in communication, maths and reading. We hope you all have a restful and safe holiday, looking forward to more fun and learning in Term 3!





We participated in a face painting ceremony using white as this represents unity and all. A smoke ceremony was held to cleanse our spirits, the earth and allow us to all show our respects to nature. Totem drawings were created in the sand and coloured with ochre, the Wiradjuri totem for this area is the goanna. Students participated in singing and dancing and even Mr Graham learnt how to 'shake a leg'.

Class 3 have had a number of students who are beginning to take part in the work education program practical component. Luke has excelled at The Brew Café and Sam is eager to start at Café Corporation next week. We have received some positive feedback from local childcare facilities on how students are representing our school while conducting themselves at work experience.
